Honouring Stakeholder Experiences with the Commonwealth Youth Programme (CYP)

In August 2023, the <u>Commonwealth Youth Programme (CYP)</u> celebrates 50 years of supporting key stakeholders to promote the empowerment of young people who are key to the prosperity of the Commonwealth. The Programme's thought leadership, capacity-building and technical assistance programmes have transformed the global environment for advancing youth development work and for recognising the contributions of young people to social, economic and political development.

Commonwealth Heads of Government also declared 2023 as a year dedicated to youth-led action for sustainable and inclusive development. During the 2023 Year of Youth, the Secretariat, Member States, youth workers and young leaders are organising special activities to energise stakeholders about youth development; to empower them to co-create with young people; to engage them in new partnerships for an enabling environment; and to envision peaceful and sustainable futures for the Commonwealth.

One of the special activities involves documenting the 50-year history of the CYP. The research project will highlight positive outcomes and challenges while raising questions about the way forward for the Programme.

- What were some of the key issues, events and personalities that influenced the work of the CYP and how you engaged?
- How do you think the CYP should strengthen its programming going forward?
- Do you have any photographs or video and audio recordings which you would like to share?
