CELEBRATIONS TO MARK QUEEN'S PLATINUM JUBILEE

Commonwealth-wide plans are under way to celebrate the Platinum Jubilee of H.M. Queen Elizabeth who acceded to the throne on 6 February 1952 on the death of her father, King George VI. At the time, she was on an official visit to Kenya.



Two days later, in London, she presided over her first meeting of the Privy Council when she read out her Declaration of Sovereignty. She was 25 years old. About to turn 96 on 21 April, Queen Elizabeth II has the distinction of being the longest-serving monarch in British history.

On becoming Queen, Elizabeth also took on her father's role as Head of the Commonwealth, the oldest political association of sovereign states in the world, the majority of which are former British colonies. Today, most of the 54 members are republics, five have their own mon-

archs, and 15 have Queen Elizabeth as Head of State.

The main Jubilee celebrations will be held in London around the anniversary of the Coronation on 7 June 1952. In Canberra, the RCS ACT Branch is planning a special Celebration Dinner on Tuesday 15 March at the Commonwealth Club. Our Guests of Honour are the Governor-General, our Patron, H.E. General the Hon. NEW DATE SET FOR RWANDA CHOGM

The twice-postponed Commonwealth Heads of Government meeting in Kigali, Rwanda, will now take place in the week beginning 20 June 2022.

The decision to hold the meeting in Rwanda was taken at the London CHOGM in 2018. CHOGMs are the highest consultative and policy-making meetings of Commonwealth Heads and are usually held every two years. The COVID-19 pandemic, however, resulted in the meeting planned for June 2020 being postponed and also a subsequent meeting that was to have taken place in 2021.

The June 2022 date was announced in a joint statement from the Commonwealth Secretariat by the Rwandan President, the Hon. Paul Kagame, and the Commonwealth Secretary-General, the Hon. Patricia Scotland. Major topics to be covered at the meeting include recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic, tackling climate change and poverty, boosting trade and promoting sustainable development.

Rwanda became a member of the Commonwealth in 2009. With Mozambique, it is the only other member that has not at some time been administered by Britain.

ESSAY TOPICS TO EXPLORE COMMONWEALTH VALUES, PRINCIPLES

Entrants in the annual Queen's Commonwealth Essay Competition each year are asked to explore the values and principles of the Commonwealth through themes ranging from the Environment to Youth Leadership and Gender Equality.

This year will be no different, except that subjects will reflect on what can be achieved through dedication and selfless commitment to our Commonwealth communities such as that exemplified by Queen Elizabeth as she celebrates her Platinum Jubilee.

The 2022 Competition, to be launched in London during Commonwealth Week in March, is the oldest international writing competition in the world. Past winners who have gone on to become prominent leaders include the Prime Minister of Singapore, Mr Lee Hsien Loong, Pulitzer Prize winning journalist Mei Fong, and renowned author, Elspeth Huxley.

Winners travel to the United Kingdom for a week of educational and cultural activities culminating in a special Awards Ceremony, usually at Buckingham Palace.

Topics for both Junior and Senior sections will be announced at the launch in March. Entries must be received by the end of June.

Although many schools around the world encourage pupils to enter the competition, entries can be independent of schools. Young people themselves are encouraged to follow the links on the RCS London website www.thercs.org to find out more about age guidelines, entry forms and other details.
